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
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
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
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
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
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












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
Introduction


Thank you for downloading the *Bears and Bunnies Spring Colors Game*. I hope it helps the children you work with learn to recognize colors in a fun way.


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









Flower Cards Instructions for Assembly

- 1. Print on paper or card stock.
- Cut apart.
 Laminate for durability if desired.









Playing Pieces Instructions for Assembly

Rules for Play:

- 1. Print the page on printer paper or card stock.
- 2. Laminate for durability, if desired.

Falling Keys Indicator Chart:

- 1. Print the page on printer paper or card stock.
- 2. Laminate for durability, if desired.

Markers:

- 1. Print the page on card stock.
- 2. Cut out the markers.
- 3. Laminate for durability, if desired.

Playing Pieces:

- Step 1: Print the page on card stock.
- Step 2: Cut out the playing pieces.
- Step 3: Fold the playing piece on Line 1 so that the Figure sides are facing out as shown in Fig. 1.
- Step 4: Flip the piece over and fold on Line 2 as shown in Fig. 2.
- Step 5: Complete Steps 3 and 4 on the other side of the piece. When you are done, it should look like Fig. 3.
- Step 6: Put glue on the inside of both Base Tops and on one blank side of the Figure section. See Fig. 4.
- Step 7: Bring all of the sections in so that the Base Tops are glued to the Base Bottom and the blank sides of the two Figures are also glued together. It should look like Fig. 5.
- Step 8: Hold the playing piece for a minute or so until the glue holds or use paper clips to hold it together until it dries. When finished, it should look like Fig. 6.










Game Board Instructions for Assembly

As shown at right, there are four types of pieces that make up the game: 1) one with the image and a white border on two sides, 2) one with the image and a border on the bottom, 3) one with the image and a border on one side, and 4) one with just the image.

Note that some sides of each piece have a solid gray line and others have just the edge of the image. Look carefully for these when cutting out the pieces so that you don't accidentally cut off a section of the game.

When assembling the game, the image portion of one piece will be glued on top of the white border of another. All but one of the pieces are labeled with letters. Use these letters as a guide when assembling the game board as explained below.



Step 1: Print the game pages on printer paper.

Step 2: Cut out the pieces.


Step 3: Using the figure at right as a guide, assemble the individual pieces in the following order:

- 1. Glue piece B on A.
- 2. Glue piece C on B.
- 3. Glue piece E on D.
- 4. Glue piece F on E.
- 5. Glue piece H on G.
- 6. Glue the unlabeled piece on H.

Step 4: Assemble the previously glued sets of pieces as follows:

- 1. Glue pieces D, E, & F on A, B, & C.
- 2. Glue pieces G, H, and the unlabeled piece on D, E, & F.

Step 5: When the glue is dry, laminate the game for durability.



Bears and Bunnies Spring Colors Game Rules for Play

Take your bear or bunny on a walk through the flower garden and get him or her home before dark.

Game Setup:

Shuffle the Flower Cards and put them face down on or beside the board where everyone can reach them. Put your playing piece on the multi-colored square with the arrow. You will begin the game by moving in the direction of the arrow.

Object of the Game:

Get your playing piece back to the multi-colored square by moving it all the way around the board.

Game Play:

On his turn, each player draws one Flower Card. If it is a card with only a flower on it, he moves his piece forward to the next colored square that matches the color of the flower. If it is a card with a flower and an arrow on it, he moves his piece backward to the closest colored square that matches the color of the flower. Play then goes to the next player.

Variations for Play:

There are two ways this game can be played:

- 1. Competitive Version The player who reaches the multi-colored square first wins the game and the game is over.
- 2. Cooperative Version The game ends when everyone gets his piece to the multi-colored square and everyone wins the game.
