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

About St. Patrick's Breastplate

St. Patrick was a Christian missionary who traveled around Ireland in the 5th century A.D. On his journeys, he and his followers were occasionally at risk of attack by non-believers. To remedy this situation, St. Patrick composed a hymn which he sang as a prayer for their protection. This hymn came to be known as "The Lorica of St. Patrick." A lorica is a kind of spiritual armor or breastplate which is how the hymn got the name we are familiar with today, "St. Patrick's Breastplate."

About This Book

The copywork in this book is based on the abridged version of "St. Patrick's Breastplate" that you find in prayer books and hymnals today. However, I have also included a complete version of the piece at the end of this.

Suggestions for Use

There are multiple ways this copywork can be used. Your child can:

- write directly on the pages of this book,
- copy the text into a notebook or onto specially lined handwriting paper,
- create a poster with it,
- write it into a prayer book.

Recommended Music

Listening to classical music while handwriting can make a potentially tedious task more fun. It also turns copywork into a multi-sensory experience because it adds auditory input to the already existing visual one. This multi-sensory approach strengthens connections in the child's brain. In addition, this technique is valuable for reaching children of a variety of learning styles.
